Only five other men have played more games than defensive back, Adrion "Pee Wee" Smith. Smith was a six-time Division All-Star and two-time All-Canadian. This Kansas City, Missouri native has become a recent retiree of the CFL. After playing 12 years, 10 years being with Toronto Argonauts, he continues his passion for football as a Community Relations Ambassador of the Argonauts, as well as President of JAMM Tours Inc., a company he started in 2001.

A Southwest Missouri State University alumnus, he graduated with a minor in Psychology and a major in Human Resources. Following his football career he pursued his MFDA license and published a successful book, giving him a better understanding in faced challenges, and making him a more successful wholesaler.

The legend of Smith will continue with his three victorious Grey Cup Championships and four time CFL All-Star titles. Along with those achievements, Smith holds numerous amounts of additional records in CFL history, such as longest kick return for a touchdown, "Interception King", leading the CFL with 8, as well as being inducted into the Southwest Missouri State University Hall of Fame in 2008.

These accomplishments are not the only attributes that have given Smith the "Fan Favourite" title. He offers his time to help better the youth in the GTA and surrounding areas. He has spoken to over 450 schools, and has been involved with numerous community projects including co-starting the Toronto Argonauts Anti-Bullying program, in 1999 called Huddle-Up Against Bullying.

Once Smith's football career came to an end, he became a radio analyst for the Argos in 2007 and a CFL analyst on Rogers Sportsnet in 2008. Smith enjoys being a family man the most; during his spare time, he coaches his son's baseball and basketball teams.
